Scripture: Luke 5:1-11, Matthew 4:18-22

- If you could summarize the sermon in one minute, what would you say?
- Read Matthew 4:18-22. How does that description of the disciple's call make you feel compared to that in Luke 5:1-11?
- Is there one small step of obedience that you feel God has been asking you to take? Why haven't you taken it vet?
- Ask Jesus to make clear for you a next step you could take this week.
- What are some ways that God could use your skills, experience, education or interests to advance His kingdom?

Jesus always makes the first move, before He asks the first disciples for something significant, He asks for something simple. Jesus takes their simple step of obedience and does something remarkable with it. In doing so, the fishermen recognize Jesus is worth giving everything up for.
