His original audience had been brought up with the world view that God blesses the richif you're rich, it's a sign of God's favor. "Be salt and light for THE WORLD?!" Words directed at those who had been taught their whole lives to stay away from the
	world. Change was in the windsomething better, broader, for the whole world. To a people who had been praying for a Messiah who would secure the borders and expel the foreigners, Jesus said: "It's time for you to cross your borders and take the love of God to foreigners wherever you can find them, and tell them what it means to follow Me."
