"Outsiders & Insiders"	When we read narratives of Jesus' healing ministry we tend to fixate on the healing miracles and miss the ethnicity of those healed. One of these groups was the Sidonians. Generations of hatred against the Sidonians had built up to the point where many from the Jewish tribes wouldn't dare go to Sidon or even talk with someone from

The common belief among Jesus' tribe was "We're the faithful, we're the chosen, we're the ones God loves. We're INSIDERS. Enemies like the Sidonians are OUTSIDERS. We're on God's side, they're not." But Jesus would dismiss, even reverse this history and would heal and bless Sidonians. Jesus wasn't about outsiders and insiders – anyone open to Him, anyone hungry to grow, learn, and be transformed was welcomed. Regardless of where they were from.
